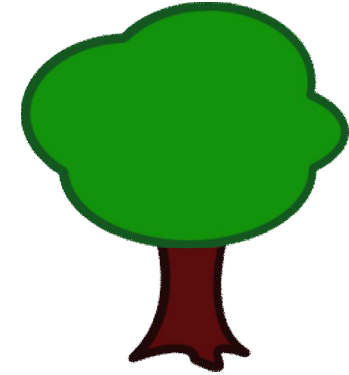

What is a diaper service?

We are a professional laundry service that provides reusable cloth diapers and equipment to parents. Soiled diapers are exchanged weekly for fresh clean diapers right at your front door.

How does our diaper service work?

For every new parent that calls, we stop by their home and explain the in's and out's of cloth diapers. This rarely takes more than 5 to 10 minutes, using modern diapers. Modern cloth diapers do not use diaper pins and rubber pants like your grandmother used, but rather use Velcro® and Snappi® attachments, which is very similar to changing with disposable diapers.

Once parents are trained, parents pay a deposit for the cloth diapers they will use. We then drop off a load of clean diapers, covers, and a diaper pail for your use. We set up a weekly schedule where we will stop by and pick up a bag of soiled diapers at your front door. The soiled diapers are replaced with freshly sanitized, cloth diapers to use the following week. Once the system is set up, it is no more difficult than setting out your trash every week for the garbage man.

Why use a cloth diaper service?

Baby's Health: Cloth diapers help baby's skin "breathe" better, which typically leads to less diaper rash. Also, babies in cloth diapers usually potty train several months earlier than babies in disposable diapers.

We only use commercial grade equipment and wash our diapers between 160 to 180 degrees to ensure that our diapers are properly sanitized.

Ease of use: Modern cloth diapers no longer require the use of safety pins, or "rubber pants" to cover your child. Today diaper covers have Velcro® that fasten and unfasten similar to a cloth diaper. We also encourage the use of Snappi® Diaper Fasteners that ensure your baby's diaper is properly fitted.

Costs: Our service is often cheaper than using disposable diapers. As of January 1, 2010, our weekly price for service is between \$12.95 to \$16.95 dollars (plus tax), depending on quantity ordered. At the start of service we require a one time, \$100 deposit for diapers and equipment, fully refunded at the end of services, with all diapers and equipment returned in a reasonable condition. Environmental: Land fills are simply not designed for the synthetic plastics and human waste that accompanies disposable diapers. This waste can eventually end up in the water table.

It is estimated that roughly 5 million tons of untreated waste and 2 billion tons of urine, feces, plastic and paper are added to landfills every year from disposable diapers.¹ It is actually illegal to dump human waste in most landfills, since human feces and urine can contaminate the water table.

Disposable diaper companies get around this legality by printing on every package that human waste should be rinsed and discarded in the toilet, before throwing the diaper away. Nonetheless, less than one half of one percent of all waste from single use diapers go into the sewer system.² Our service puts all human waste through the public sewer system, for proper disposal.
